Dear Associates,

Happy New Year! As is traditional with the change in the calendar, it is a good time to reflect on the progress of 2023 and the plans for 2024. Over the past 12 months the Center to Advance Manufacturing has grown from a vision to connect industry with higher education to a fully functioning office.

The Center has worked to build strong relationships with local economic development professionals through monthly communications and analysis. Additionally, the Center provides information on county economies, imports, and workforce data. This data has become a tool for Economic Development Directors to enhance their retention and expansion efforts as well as a way to track changes to their workforce.

The Center is also directly supporting industry. In 2023 we assisted companies with improving manufacturing processes, leadership training, language training for non-English speaking associates, supply chain analysis, access to students, and incumbent worker training.

2023 also saw the establishment of several programs and partnerships, some of which are noted here. Owens Community College established a CDL program in Findlay, BGSU was awarded a National Science Foundation grant to establish certificate training for manufacturing, and Owens and the Center each applied for Individual Microcredential Assistance Program (IMAP) training dollars from the State of Ohio. In addition, the University of Findlay is working to establish an electric vehicle training program with the Center for Automotive Research.

The Center is working on several new initiatives for 2024 as well. In February, we will be onboarding a Workforce Training Coordinator. This position is intended to be utilized by industry, economic development, and education across Northwest Ohio to leverage workforce training programs. For example, it is our goal to significantly increase the amount of Tech Cred, IMAP, On-the-Job-Training, Incumbent Worker Training, and other programs to support manufacturing training. All too often we hear multiple reasons why the programs are underutilized. The Workforce Training Coordinator position will establish the "easy" button for users and providers to access the programs. In addition, the Center is working closely with the Northwest Ohio Innovation Consortium to submit an Ohio Innovation Hub application. Earlier this week the Toledo Blade published an article detailing our involvement in the process (https://buff.ly/3NNhOlz). It has been an impressive and rewarding experience to see Northwest Ohio businesses and institutions collaborate on this application. The State of Ohio will award the Innovation Hub funding later in 2024. Later this month the Center will host its first quarterly Advisory Board meeting with representatives from Dana, First Solar, Grob, Ohio Logistics, Principle Business Enterprises, Roki, ValGroup, Whirlpool, and Yarder Manufacturing.

### **NOMA Quarterly Meeting**

Ford Weber, Program Manager, attended the Northwest Ohio Manufacturing Alliance's (NOMA) quarterly meeting in early December. Presenters from the Toledo Regional Chamber of Commerce, The Ohio Manufacturers' Association, and Principle Business Enterprises shared their insights and provided industry updates. The meeting provided a great opportunity for networking and collaboration among manufacturing professionals.







### **Wood County Economic Development** Commission

Weber attended the Wood County Economic **Development Commission** Membership meeting. Sandy Spang, Executive Director of the Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments, presented on regional economic development strategies.





### **Center for Automotive Research (CAR)**

Representatives from the Center, CAR, and the University of Findlay All Hazards Training Center met in mid-December to discuss the handling of hazardous materials in relation to electric vehicles. Areas of particular interest include lithium-ion batteries, emergency response, and recycling. The lithium-ion batteries are expected to be manufactured in Ohio, and future staff will need to have the proper training to proactively and reactively handle these materials. An in-depth discussion was held on future procedures and policies, training plans, and research opportunities.

In addition, Mayle and Weber attended the Center for Automotive Research's December Drives and Holiday Vibes event in Detroit. The program was held in a newly renovated co-working and maker space in Detroit's Corktown neighborhood. The program content included updates on automotive sales forecasts and the challenge of ramping up electric vehicle production.

Over the next six years, the number of workers employed in electric vehicle manufacturing will increase ten fold, which will require a high degree of workforce training and re-training. CAR is preparing a report on the necessary skills electric vehicle manufacturers will require, which should be published within the next several months.


